Visitors' favorites include:

- Traditional artisans who demonstrate crafts in the style of the 18th century using only materials and methods available at that time. Learn how baskets were made, wooden tubs formed, tools created by blacksmiths, and much more.
- Over 50 different French, English and Native American foods adapted from original recipes prepared over open fires and served by costumed participants. Traditional favorites include fry bread, Scottish meat pies, and buffalo.
- Blanket traders and merchants sell replicas of 18th century trade goods from blankets and tents. Products for sale include colonial goods, period clothing, toys, Native American items, pewter, leather, wood, and woven goods.
- Living historians recreating the life of a Native American village, the period military camps, the colorful voyageurs, and the Habitants (French settlers who left civilization, friends, and families behind to settle in this remote part of New France).

The past is yours to savor at the Feast of the Hunters' Moon. At this historic reenactment you can recapture 18th century life at Fort Ouiatenon—the first fortified European outpost in what is now Indiana.

Continuous, free programming is held on five stages. French and Native American music and dance, fife and drum corps performances, military drills and demonstrations, fashion shows, games and contests can be enjoyed at the 50th celebration of this event. Special hands-on activities include the children's trade blanket, costume try-on, candle-dipping, story telling, bead bracelet making, cross-cut sawing, and tomahawk throwing.


